Commodore's Corner

The buildings, grounds and docks look great, thanks to the hard work of our members during our voluntary work days!

The opening cocktail party was a success in spite of threatening weather (for a second year) and we are off to a start of another season. Thirteen new members attended our orientation session prior to the cocktail party. A fine, enthusiastic group, I must say! Your commodore and Steve Landau made a presentation to them using newly revised materials prepared so capably by Steve. Anyone who is interested in having a copy of the two presentations "*Club Operations*" and "*Club Facilities*" can obtain them from Steve Landau. They are a fine, condensed resource.

On June 1st, Dick Pratt, from the Champlain Water District, briefed me on a large project they will be conducting in Shelburne Bay in July and August of this year and solicited our cooperation and input. They will be constructing an intake for their plant in Queen City Park on the vacant land between the launching area at the south end of the bay and Shelburne Park. There will be two metal pipes constructed, one 42" in diameter and a second 10" in diameter – both 2700 feet long. As the construction proceeds, these pipes will be pushed out into the bay on floats and when completed will be towed (all 2700 feet) across the bay, then submerged at Queen City Park and connected to the plant----Quite an undertaking. We will be briefed regularly, along with other maritime interests, on its progress. It ought to add a lot of interest to our bay! Please be aware that the structure will move continually further into the bay as segments are completed and will be a navigational hazard. Obviously, the Coast Guard and Vermont State Police will have an active presence during the construction.

Other Notes:

- Jill Burley's stewards are doing a great job with the launches, lawn and clubhouse. Compliment them when you have a chance.
- David and Kathy Howard donated a new grill to the club for member use Thanks to them.
- My congratulations to Bob DeSorbo and his crew. They had our docks in and completed by 10:20 on Workday – a new record - and all the lights and receptacles were identified and working.

Horace U. Ransom, 1914-2007

Horace was a Life Member and Past Commodore (1966-1967). He died peacefully in his sleep this past April. John Dinse remembers him below:

Horace was a real gentleman and sailor and an asset to the community. He was for several years President of the Chittenden Bank. He actively ran Shelburne Shipyard between the Askes and the Griswolds. That connection was very helpful in the early days of LCYC at Shelburne. I remember early docks for LCYC being built there, I would guess at little or no expense. Horace was a good friend of LCYC and of all the members who knew him!
