2004 Capital Budget Approved

The Board of Governors has completed the budget for the Club's capital expenses for 2004 and updated the Long Range Plan with prioritized projects for 2005 and 2006. The Board wishes to thank the eight members who responded to the call for input to the planning and budgeting process. While Board members wished they had had more input, the lack of a larger response indicates a vote of confidence in the Board's efforts to plan future projects meeting the needs of most of the members.

Projects scheduled for 2004 are as follows:

- Repair the "Milo" with the same attention to detail as given to the powerboats repaired in 2003.
- Install the additional moorings to bring the total to the maximum allowed under LCYC's agreement with the Town of Shelburne.
- Fabricate and install a ramped access to the main dock.
- New replacement race marks and anchor lines.
- New waterless urinals to replace existing urinals to reduce pump-out costs.
- New chairs for the clubhouse to replace plastic pipe chairs.
- ♦ Additional side chairs for house tables.
- New FJ to continue policy of maintaining and upgrading the instructional boat fleet.

Projects delayed for consideration in future years are listed below without regard for their prioritizations:

- Replacement of the "Butler" building.
- Race Committee boat.
- Additional four ramped docks with cradles for Junior dock.
- Drainage swales re-excavated.
- Driveway paving in phases.
- Replace riding lawnmower.
- Replace retaining walls south of Junior dock.
- Replace mooring puller.
- New PA system serving house and patios.
- Warming oven for kitchen.
- Four new Optimist Dinghies for Junior program.

If you wish to get involved in the process, make your own list and submit it to the Board between now and September to be considered for the 2005-and-beyond planning.



- Steve Adams has already set up much of the entertainment for 2004 (that jazz group will be at the Ladies Cup Dinner again!) and is working on the arrangements for food and other events as well.

I have been privileged to have worked with all these wonderful people who have done and will continue to do so much for the Club and its members!

Ramp to Main Dock

We are proceeding with planning for construction in 2004 of a ramp to the main dock that will allow use of the cart to move gear to and from the docks and to make dock access easier for those who have trouble with the long stairs.

Charlie Van Winkle, Doug Viehmann and I are developing several options during this phase, and we will be presenting them to the Board as well as checking with the Town and neighbors to make sure their concerns are taken into consideration.

One option is to follow a previously-considered path to the north of the walk to the main dock and transitioning to an elevated structure that returns to the concrete platform where the aluminum gangway to the dock is attached. The cost of the revised structure should be significantly lower than previously proposed because it will be made of wood instead of aluminum and will be built by members instead of by a contractor. If this option is selected, our plan is to build the timber portion with volunteer club labor and have a small contractor (maybe a member) do the upper paved part. The work will be done in April and May.

Another alternative under consideration is to create a lower, almost level walkway to the main dock extending along the bank from two new parking spaces at the foot of the Club's boat launch ramp, joining the Jr. Sailing dock and the Main dock in the process. This would be an almost "level" paved path that could be built either as a cut into the bank or as a wooden structure with adjustable legs. The parking spaces would be facilitated with construction of a new retaining wall with guardrail would replace the two deteriorating timber retaining walls now in place. A side benefit would be leveling off what has been an unusable and difficult-to-maintain sloping lawn above the old retaining walls for more picnic space as well as a space for outdoor classes.

Several volunteers have already signed up but we can use more to reduce the amount of effort needed by each volunteer.

This would be an ideal way for anyone who cannot attend Spring Workday to meet that commitment. If you have the interest and a bit of time when the weather breaks early this Spring, please contact Mike Lynch at 985-2461.

Bruce Schwab at Change of Watch

Veteran ocean sailor Bruce Schwab will provide the program at the 2004 Change of Watch on Saturday, January 24.

Bruce grew up living on a sailboat on the waters of Washington State, the Caribbean, Mexico, and California. He has raced and lived in the San Francisco Bay Area for the past 20 years.

As a member of the SF Bay's Single-handed Sailing Society (SSS), he's won nearly every West Coast single-handed race, including the 1996 Single-handed Transpac race aboard "Rumbleseat," his famous highly modified 1930 "30 Square Meter."

Bruce took the aging 60-year old boat and completely re-made her. Modifications included a high-tech rigging system designed to blend power and handling ease for long distance single-handed sailing. His efforts bore fruit when in 1996, "Rumbleseat" completed the single-handed Transpac race with a day and a half margin of victory.

He is only American racing an American boat in the Open 60 circuit, and has logged over 60,000 ocean miles during his meticulously planned campaign towards the start line of the upcoming Vendée Globe.

Other racing results:


- In 1997, Bruce completely re-designed the rigging for Azzura, a custom 30 foot sport boat. He went on to skipper her to victory in the 1998 double-handed class of the Pacific Cup race to Hawaii.
- In 2000 he co-skippered **Rage**, a Wylie/Schooner Creek 70ft Turbosled, to first in division in the Pacific Cup race to Hawaii.
- In his own home waters, the often dangerous area from San Francisco to the Farallone Islands, he has taken division first places in the double-handed Farallones for five years running from 1984 through 1989 then again in 1995, 1998, and 2001.

But winning isn't everything... In 1999, Bruce and crew member Joakim Jonsson were awarded the Arthur B. Hansen medals by US Sailing for the rescue of fellow sailor Gary Helms after Helms capsized his boat off the California coast during the rough 1999 Doublehanded Farallones Race.

In Bruce's words:

"You have to be pretty nuts to do what we do as single-handed, around the world sailors. But I'm pretty amazed that I'm still the only American with an American boat competing on the Open 60 international circuit. I've got to believe that's going to change some time real soon. I love the X Games, and I'm looking forward to watching a whole new generation of young American sailors getting the support to be doing this on the next generation of Extreme Sports. That would be awesome indeed."
