Sailing Instructions (SIs)

[Revised 08/01/21]

1 RULES

1.1 This event is governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*.

2 OTHER DOCUMENTS THAT GOVERN THIS EVENT

2.1 LCYC Courses and Race Marks on LCYC website (<http://lcyg.info/racing/documents>) under RACING / DOCUMENTS.

3 CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 3.1 Any change to the sailing instructions will be posted before 0900 the day it will take effect, except that any change to the schedule of races will be posted by 2000 on the day before it will take effect.
- 3.2 Changes to a sailing instruction or to the designated course may be given on the water following the raising of the "L" flag with one sound.

4 COMMUNICATIONS WITH COMPETITORS

- 4.1 Notices to competitors will be posted on the official notice board located online at (<http://lcyg.info/racing/documents>).
- 4.2 On the water, the race committee intends to communicate with competitors via radio on VHF 72.

5 SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

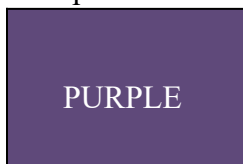
5.1 Signals made ashore will be made from RC boat located on the main dock.

6 SCHEDULE OF RACES

- 6.1 Race date: September 11, 2021
- 6.2 There will not be a skippers' meeting ashore. Race committee will use VHF 72 to communicate with the fleet, first broadcast at 0900, others may follow.
- 6.3 The orange start-line flag will be displayed once the committee boat is on station and the line is set.
- 6.4 The first warning will be at 1030.

7 CLASS FLAGS

7.1 Spinnaker



7.2 Jib and Main



8 COURSES

8.1 All Spinnaker boats will sail the LONG COURSE, 73.6 nm in length.

8.2 All Jib and Main boats will sail the SHORT COURSE, 48.2 nm in length.

8.3 EVEN YEAR LONG COURSE (73.6 NM)

- Start at the Lake Champlain Yacht Club between the RC boat and the adjacent mark
- Leave RN "2" off Shelburne Point to port
- Leave Diamond Island to starboard
- Leave RGN "LR" off La Roche Reef to starboard
- Leave RN "2" off Shelburne Point to starboard
- Finish at the Lake Champlain Yacht Club between the RC boat and the adjacent mark

8.4 EVEN YEAR SHORT COURSE

- Start at the Lake Champlain Yacht Club between the RC boat and the adjacent mark
- Leave RN "2" off Shelburne Point to port
- Leave Diamond Island to starboard
- Leave Valcour Island to starboard
- Leave RN "2" off Shelburne Point to starboard
- Finish at the Lake Champlain Yacht Club between the RC boat and the adjacent mark

8.5 ODD YEAR LONG COURSE (73.6 NM)

- Start at the Lake Champlain Yacht Club between the RC boat and the adjacent mark
- Leave RN "2" off Shelburne Point to port
- Leave RGN "LR" off La Roche Reef to port
- Leave Diamond Island to port
- Leave RN "2" off Shelburne Point to starboard
- Finish at the Lake Champlain Yacht Club between the RC boat and the adjacent mark

8.6 ODD YEAR SHORT COURSE

- Start at the Lake Champlain Yacht Club between the RC boat and the adjacent mark
- Leave RN "2" off Shelburne Point to port
- Leave Valcour Island to port
- Leave Diamond Island to port
- Leave RN "2" off Shelburne Point to starboard
- Finish at the Lake Champlain Yacht Club between the RC boat and the adjacent mark

8.7 In the event that the race is shortened at Diamond Island, the finish line shall be between the orange flag of the Race Committee boat and the Diamond Island Light.

9.0 MARKS

9.1 Marks used in LCYC races are described in (<http://lcyg.info/racing/documents>). LCYC permanent marks are orange cans. Drop marks are inflatable orange tetrahedrons and orange hip-hops.

10 THE START

10.1 Races will be started using RRS 26 with the following change: There will be a one-minute gap between each start signal and the following warning signal:

- Spinnaker division warning 1030 start 1035
- Jib & Main division warning 1036 start 1041

10.2 The starting line is between a staff displaying an orange flag on the signal vessel at the starboard end and the course side of the port-end starting mark.

10.3 Following a long postponement the orange starting line flag will be displayed with 4-5 short blasts at least four (4) minutes before the AP is lowered.

10.4 Boats whose warning signal has not been made shall avoid the starting area during the starting sequence for other boats.

10.5 If any part of a boat's hull is on the course side of the starting line during the two minutes before

her starting signal and she is identified, the race committee will attempt to broadcast her sail number on VHF channel 72. Failure to make a broadcast or to time it accurately will not be grounds for a request for redress. This changes RRS 62.1(a).

10.6 If any part of a boat's hull is on the course side of the starting line at her starting signal and she is identified the race committee will attempt to hail her sail number. Failure to hail her number, failure of her to hear such a hail, or the order in which boats are hailed will not be grounds for a request for redress. This changes RRS 62.1(a).

10.7 A boat that does not start within ten minutes after her starting signal will be scored Did Not Start without a hearing. This changes RRS A5.1 and A5.2.

11 SHORTEN COURSE

11.1 When either the Spin flag or JaM flag is displayed with the S flag the shortened course applies only to that division.

12 CHANGE OF THE NEXT LEG OF THE COURSE

12.1 When either the Spin flag or JaM flag is displayed with the C flag the course change applies only to that division.

12.2 The race committee will announce the new course orally, or by VHF 72, or both.

13 THE FINISH

13.1 The finishing line is between a staff displaying an orange flag on a race committee boat and the course side of the adjacent mark unless the course is shortened.

13.2 If the race committee signals a shortened course, the finishing line shall be between an orange flag on a race committee boat and the course side of the adjacent mark. This changes rule 32.2.

13.3 If the race committee is absent when a boat finishes, she shall report at her first reasonable opportunity her finishing time in local universal time, in hours/min/sec, when the course side of the finishing mark is abeam of the boat's mast, leaving the mark on the proper side. Should the race committee not be available directly, reporting should be made via email to regatta@lcy.info .

14 TIME LIMIT

14.1 To be scored, a boat must finish prior to 1300 hours, plus her PHRF time allowance against the highest rated boat in her class, on the second day of the race.

15 PENALTY SYSTEM

15.1 Appendix V, Alternative Penalties, V1 & V2 apply.

16 PROTESTS

16.1 RRS Appendix T – Arbitration applies to this event.

16.2 All forms required for filing a protest may be found on the LCYC website <http://lcy.info/racing/documents>.

16.3 The formal protest shall be submitted on standard forms to the Regatta Chairman within twenty-four (24) hours of a boat's finish.

16.4 Forms may be submitted via email to regatta@lcy.info .

17 SCORING

17.1 Boats will be scored on corrected time using the time-on-time method based on their Lake Champlain PHRF rating.

18 SAFETY REGULATIONS

- 18.1 A boat that retires from the race shall notify the race committee at the first reasonable opportunity.
- 18.2 Any time while racing and wind speeds exceed 20 knots all crew members are required to wear a personal flotation device while on deck.
- 18.3 Any time while racing and conditions merit all crew members are strongly advised to wear a personal flotation device while on deck. Conditions to be considered include but are not limited to crew position, MOB risk, the wearing of foul weather gear, water temperature, air temperature, sea state, wind speed and physical ability.
- 18.4 **From dusk to sunrise: All crew on deck must wear a life-saving device. It must be equipped with a whistle. Each crew must also have a waterproof flashlight or similar form of visual signal attached to either their life-saving device or their person.**
- 18.5 No race will be started when sustained winds are in excess of 25 knots.

19 PRIZES

- 19.1 This race is part of the Billado / Cannon Series, comprised of eight races: Tea Kettle, Odziozo, Lady Skipper, Mid-Lake, Ladies Cup, Schuyler Island, Macdonough, and Hot-Ruddered Bum.
- 19.2 The Billado (Spinnaker) and Cannon (Jib & Main) rotating trophies will be awarded to the boat with the lowest overall series score within their division.
- 19.3 The top three finishers in each class in this series will also be recognized.
- 19.4 Boats will be allowed 1 throw-out if more than 3 races are sailed, 2 throw-outs if all 8 races are sailed.
- 19.5 For the series, DNC will be scored = the maximum number of boats that came to the start for any race in the series +1, per division, or per class.

20 RISK STATEMENT

- 20.1 RRS 3 states: 'The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue to race is hers alone.' By participating in this event each competitor agrees and acknowledges that sailing is a potentially dangerous activity with inherent risks. These risks include strong winds and rough seas, sudden changes in weather, failure of equipment, boat handling errors, poor seamanship by other boats, loss of balance on an unstable platform and fatigue resulting in increased risk of injury. **Inherent in the sport of sailing is the risk of permanent, catastrophic injury or death by drowning, trauma, hypothermia or other causes.**

21 INSURANCE

- 21.1 Each participating boat shall be insured with a valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of \$300,000 per incident or the equivalent.

22.0 GUEST MOORINGS

- 22.1 If you would like to come to LCYC before the race, we have a few guest moorings available by reservation. Please make advance arrangements with the club stewards for a mooring, tie-up space for your dinghy, or possible pickup at your anchorage by a club member. During club operating hours (1100 to 2100 weekdays, 0900 to 2100 weekends & holidays) the clubhouse phone number is [802-985-3372](tel:802-985-3372), stewards monitor Ch 12.
- 22.2 There are good anchorages in Sled Runner cove north of the club, or off Allen Hill to the south.
