 - 2.1.1. South End Project
 - 2.1.1.1. Fencing is here but is still in construction. The resurfacing of the old shed site is still underway as more material is needed
 - 2.1.2. Lake Encroachment Permit
 - 2.1.2.1. The application for review from BOG should be ready for the July meeting
 - 2.1.3. 2021 Audit
 - 2.1.3.1. Response to the audit starts tomorrow at the FC meeting

4. Treasurer Report - 6/13/22

- Approved budget is here.
- The balance sheet is here.
- The YTD income/expense vs budget report is here.
- The projection spreadsheet is here. Note: graphs are only valid through May. In summary, net income is above projected by about \$19K, mostly due to Jr Sailing class fees higher than projected and Social expense lower than projected..
- The Capital fund balance is \$246,397.69 (\$214,138.88 YE'21 + \$32,258.81 '22 net income).
- Additional mooring fee refunds have been issued to 2 members allowing use of their moorings for 2022
- Cost for pumpout increased 40%.
- Costs that go over budgets need to be accepted by BOG.

 - 5.1.1. Goal is to have a signature, private vessel to SBC.
 - 5.1.2. Operation is run out of Safe Harbor in several locations.
 - 5.1.3. When trips are hosted by LCYC members and boats, SBC would like pick up and drop offs to be done off the end of LCYC dock. SBC will not encourage the guests to stay and socialize at LCYC after the trip.
 - 5.1.4. SBC does not anticipate more than 40 trips out of LCYC this summer. Most trips will be on Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays.
