



For the Saloon Table, Book Review by Bette Reuter: The Hungry Ocean, by Linda Greenlaw (Hyperion Press).

One is first taken by the fact that Linda Greenlaw is a swordboat captain and a woman. That made for a potentially good read. And it was. Her spunk is refreshing when she writes "observations and philosophies might not interest all readers but are included because it is my book".

There are lots of trials and tribulations, bad weather, and the hard routine of operating a sea-going fishing boat off the Grand Banks of Newfoundland. All of which you experience as though you were shadowing her on a trip. If you're interested in a version of the real life challenges of a sword fisherman, then this book is for you.
