


In other words, she knows the rules! Pat currently races Etchells in Marblehead an San Diego.

<u>Commodore's Corner</u>

The reappraisal and resulting changes in the Club's property taxes in Shelburne occupied our attention during the first quarter of 2003. Early in the quarter, the Board voted to minimize all expenditures and wait until the new appraisal was published. Our previous assessment was \$512,000.

On May 4, the "Preliminary Results of the 2003 Reappraisal" pegged our "market rate" property value at \$722,200, an increase of 42%. However, our taxes are likely to remain essentially the same or drop slightly due to an adjustment in the rate from \$2.61 to an estimated rate of \$1.79.

With a measured sigh of relief, the Board has voted to complete the projects proposed for 2003 in the Long Range Plan.

Prior to Workday, many hours were spent by Bob Platt and his volunteers installing the new metal screened louvers on the rooftop monitor. Under Bill Aldrich's uncompromising eye, others are still working to prepare LCYC's powerboats for the season.

Chuck Bowen, our Fleet Chaplain, reminded us that Frank O'Connor had been in the hospital and was recuperating at home. Nothing can keep Frank down for long. He showed up to have lunch! He didn't stay long, but he was, indeed there for Workday. Congratulations, Frank! We're all pulling for your quick recovery.

For the first time in over thirty years, Dale Hyerstay missed a Workday. Bob Schumacher stood in for him in the pickup truck donated for the event by Shearer Chevrolet. Dale had to fill in for his fellow employees at the Chimney Sweep. He will be back for the Fall Workday, for sure.

The website, database and "Log" are in the process of merging, and "process" is the operative word here. A day before the "Log" went to the printer this year, several issues remained as Beth Thorpe strove to have the database software seamlessly print the "Log". 
